We provide a range of services, including emergency response, fire prevention education, and community outreach programs. Job Description: Under general supervision, this position is responsible for performing highly skilled work in emergency medical services, patient assessment and transport, engaging in specialized tasks related to fire suppression, and rescue operations. This role requires maintaining technical certifications as both a Firefighter and Emergency Medical Technician, ensuring compliance with all necessary licensures. The position involves delivering patient care in accordance with established protocols and operating within the parameters of the emergency medical technician licensure while performing additional related duties as assigned. Personnel must also provide public education when needed and represent the department in a professional manner.

- High School Diploma or GED Equivalent.
- Must be over the age of 18.
- Must be able to satisfactorily pass a state background check.
- Valid New Mexico driver's license.
- Must be able to pass USDOT physical

Essential Job Functions

- Responds to emergency incidents, executing fire suppression, rescue, and emergency medical duties as necessary to manage emergency situations.
- May act as the lead medical technician for emergency care, providing basic and advanced life support services and delegating tasks to other medical personnel.
- Operates various emergency, fire, rescue, medical, and lifesaving equipment.
- Conducts inspections, cleans, and maintains a range of equipment and tools, ensuring readiness for immediate use.
- Participates in training evolutions to enhance firefighting, rescue, and emergency medical skills.
- Fosters a good working relationship with other agencies such law enforcement, fire/EMS and other members of the communities.
- Performs other duties as assigned
- May be required to work various shifts, evenings, weekends, holidays and/or as assigned by the Fire Chief
